### BUSINESS STUDIES in English

There are about 11 million meetings in the USA every day. A meeting can be the best way to develop plans, motivate people and get action on good ideas. Yet studies show that over 50% of meeting time is wasted. Here are some ideas for better meetings.



# 1. The right arrangement of seats for a meeting:



*Creative brainstorm*: everyone sits in a circle (more democratic).



*Information/Training*: in a U-shape, so it's easier to see presentations.



Decision-making: Chairperson sits in the middle, so he or she is in the best place to hear everyone else.

#### 2. If you're organising a meeting:

- Send everyone a note stating the meeting place, starting and finishing time.
- Prepare an agenda a list of the topics to discuss.
- Use ICT and other tools like flip charts.
- Name a person to take the minutes (write a report about the meeting).

#### 3. If you're attending a meeting:

- Read the agenda carefully.
- Prepare information you need for the discussion.
- Ask only important questions during the meeting. Don't go off track.
